Calling for a Special Higher Education Sector Conference on the future of the Pay and Conditions dispute

Oxford UCU notes:

- 1. The current state of the Four Fights ('UCU Rising') dispute, with no further development announced since the ballot in November 2023.
- 2. The issues of pay inequalities, excessive workloads, casualisation, and pay degradation remain unresolved.
- 3. Without an active dispute on any of these issues, employers are increasing attacks on jobs and working conditions branch by branch.
- 4. The crisis in the Teachers' Pension Scheme (TPS).
- 5. That a number of post-92 universities have announced significant redundancies, including Oxford Brookes University.
- 6. As a union, we need to make collective decisions about the next steps of the dispute.

Oxford UCU resolves to:

- 1. Support post-92 branches in their fight against redundancies.
- 2. Call on the Higher Education Committee (HEC) to trigger a UK-wide dispute over TPS at the Joint Negotiating Committee for Higher Education Staff (JNCHES) and to support post-92 branches.
- 3. Call for a Special Higher Education Sector Conference (SHESC) on the future of the Four Fights/JNCHES disputes and including a potential TPS dispute.
- 4. Call on HEC to commit publicly to implementing the decisions at that Conference in the first post-HEC communications.
