Passed at Extraordinary General Meeting on 14th January 2025

Motion in support of the Climate and Nature (CAN) Bill

This branch notes:

- The Climate and Nature (CAN) Bill will have its second hearing in parliament on Friday the 24th of January, having been denied parliamentary time during the previous Conservative government
- The CAN bill will bring more ambitious actions for addressing our climate and nature crises into legislation, and with greater urgency:
 - Meeting the UK's commitment to reducing emissions required to prevent catastrophic climate change, reducing the UK's greenhouse gas emissions in line with 1.5°C, including emissions overseas
 - Building on the Environment Act to reverse biodiversity loss by 2030
 - Holding a climate and nature assembly to work with the UK government to develop an emergency strategy
- While many MPs have already committed to attend the parliamentary session and support the bill, many MPs have not made such a commitment, including the MP for Oxford East, Anneliese Dodds, who is the parliamentary representative for a significant number of our branch members

This branch believes:

- As one of the world's most nature-depleted countries, the UK government must increase its ambition and action in line with the science
- It is imperative that MPs back the CAN bill in parliament, as it includes stricter, more comprehensive and scientifically literate climate and biodiversity targets than current legislation
- Such targets have a greater chance of effectively restricting the effects of extreme
 weather, food systems disruption and depletion of the natural world, all of which have a
 direct impact upon our members
- The climate and nature assembly included in the CAN bill provides essential democratic accountability and fairness to the process of the climate change mitigation and adaptation

This branch resolves to:

- 1. As a branch, author and sign a letter urging MPs to attend the session and support the bill, with text based on the UCU template letter for branches
- 2. Send this letter to MPs representing Oxford: Layla Moran and Anneliese Dodds
- Include a point in the next branch bulletin urging members to write their own letters to MPs
